

SERMON BASED STUDY GUIDE

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Hope and Transformation Through the Resurrection of Christ

OPENING & PRAYER:

SCRIPTURE:

For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

Now if Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? 13 But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. 14 And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty. 1 Corinthians 15:12-14

GO DEEPER:

The resurrection is a testament to God's love for humanity. Jesus' mission was to seek and save the lost, as illustrated in the parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. These parables highlight the value God places on each individual and His relentless pursuit to bring us back into His fold. The lost son, in particular, represents humanity's estrangement from God and the Father's unwavering love and desire for reconciliation.

Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection are central to our salvation. His death was our death; He took

upon Himself the sins of the world. His burial signifies the end of our old life, and His resurrection offers us a new life filled with hope and purpose. Christianity is unique in that it offers a complete transformation, taking our old, sinful life and replacing it with a new, redeemed life in Christ.

The symbol of our faith is not scales of justice but the cross, which signifies grace and redemption. We are not saved by our works but by faith in Jesus Christ. God loves us unconditionally, and our rebellion is what separates us from His love. Jesus made a way for us to return to the Father, offering rest for our souls and a relationship that brings true peace and fulfillment.
